Llyn Dinas $\star \star \clubsuit$ 2 miles NE of Beddgelert. Locals swim in the evening from the footpath at the south end. Best access is from the road side of the river, as entry on the far side is shallow and slippery. N53.02279° W4.07022°, SH612492, (\bowtie LL55 4NH is north of the lake). Relatively warm water.

river narrows. N42.25092° W0.08681° **Puente Pedruel★★★** 2Km south of Rodellar. Turn off the HU-341 for "Camping 800m" N42.27088° W0.07999°. Limited

Los Estrechos \star \star \odot \odot A tricky 200m walk upstream from the far bank of the Puente. N42.27370° W0.08263°. A long narrowing gorge, with the depth varying as you swim. Very beautiful, but cramped for a picnic. There is no path through the gorge, but one above it

on the right hand side. The name means *The Narrows*.

Cafe Solo★☺ ☺❀ This is upstream of Los Estrechos. Drive round
